












# How'd You Do That?

-  1. Wordle, [www.wordle.net](http://www.wordle.net), any browser, PC or MAC.
-  2. Remind101, <https://www.remind101.com/>. Begin on a computer or tablet, use a smart phone, tablet or computer to send the text messages. PC or Mac, iOS, Android.
-  3. PowToon, <http://www.powtoons.com> , Works with most browsers, Flash based, so doesn't work with iOS tablets. PC or Mac.
-  4. Jing, <http://www.techsmith.com/jing.html> , Download program to PC or Mac. Can create Videos up to 5 minutes long. Stored on their site.
-  5. Tellagami, <https://telligami.com> , This is an iPhone/iPad/Android based app. Great for teaching storytelling.
-  6. TinyURL, <http://www.tinyurl.com> . any browser, PC or Mac.
-  7. VidBolt, <https://beta.vidbolt.com> , any browser, upload You Tube video to VidBolt. Group commenting on a video. PC or Mac.
-  8. PicMonkey, <http://www.picmonkey.com/> , online photo editor, free, not registration necessary, any browser, PC or Mac.
-  9. Audacity, <http://audacity.sourceforge.net/> , free download for recording and editing audio files. PC or Mac. Need Lamb exe to export as MP3.
-  10. Adobe Voice, An iPad App, great for getting students started with digital storytelling. iOS only right now.
